If there's a heartbeat to this cellar, it is undoubtedly Bordeaux. Mark's first love and assignment, Bordeaux runs in his blood. You'll notice a light touch with the Right Bank, as those remain his favorites and he reluctantly parted only with a few special wines. The range is immense, as well-cellared classics from the '50s are here en masse, as well as modern day gems and recent releases.

"The 1959 Haut-Brion is, in my view, the most moving of the utterly profound wines on the table. Ripe and flamboyant, the 1959 races across the palate with kirsch, mint, licorice and tobacco, all in an unctuous, flashy style that captivates all the senses. A darker and more voluptuous version of the 1961, the 1959 has it all. Layered and sweet on the palate, with fabulous depth and breathtaking complexity, the 1959 boasts superb polish, a long, seamless finish and tremendous harmony. At times, the 1959 exhibits an almost Burgundian-like sense of finesse and lightness on the palate. Quite simply, this is as good as it gets.

The 1959 shows no signs of fading; rather it is likely to gradually lose intensity over the next 10-15 years, although it may last well beyond that. I wasn't born when the 1959 was made, so I can only imagine what it must have tasted like as a young wine. Even today, it is incredibly rich. In a word: unforgettable." (100 pts. The selection was incredibly severe with only 45% of the crop being utilized. A tight, but potentially gorgeous nose of graphite, black currants, licorice and camphor is followed by a full-bodied wine revealing the classic elegance, purity and delineated style of Lafite. It is phenomenally concentrated with softer tannins than the 2005, the 2003's voluptuous, broad, juicy personality, and low acidity. There are several vintages that I thought were a replay of their colossal 1959, most notably 1982 and 2003, but 2009 is also one to keep an eye on. It is still extremely youthful and seems slightly more backward than I would have guessed based on the barrel tastings, but it needs 10-15 years of bottle age, and should last for 50+." (99+ pts. It is an amazing wine, and on several occasions, I have actually picked it as a right bank Pomerol because of the lushness and succulence of the cedary, blackberry, black currant fruit. This vintage has always tasted great, even in its youth, and revealed a precociousness that one does not associate with this Chateau. However, the 1982 is still evolving at a glacial pace. 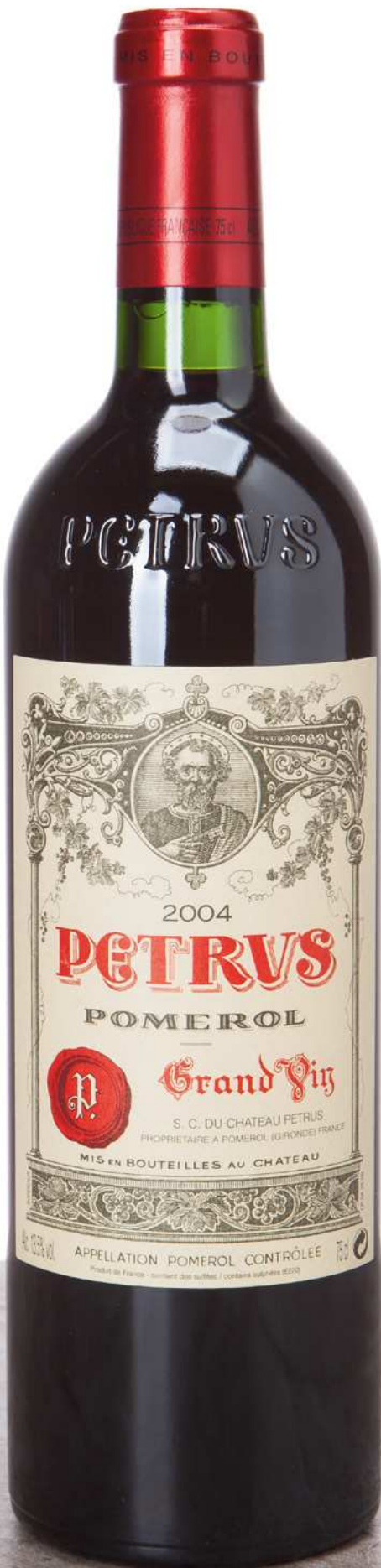

THE JUDGEMENT OF PARIS

On May 24, 1976, a wine tasting took place in Paris that changed the world's view of California wines forever. The tasting was the brainchild of Steven Spurrier, an English wine merchant who owned an innovating wine shop and adjacent wine school in the center of Paris. Having been recently introduced to California wines, and curious to see how these newcomers would fare against French wines made from the same grapes, he arranged a blind wine tasting in celebration of the American Bicentennial. The French tasters chosen for the event were professional critics of the higher caliber. Spurrier placed First Growths and Grand Cru Burgundies to be matched against California Cabernets and Chardonnays. The tasting was blind, with the identities concealed until the jury of nine tasted has voted its order of preference.

The unthinkable happened. The 1973 Stag's Leap Wine Cellars SLV Cabernet Sauvignon was judged the best wine of the tasting, besting Mouton and Haut Brion. The effect of this tasting was the proverbial shot heard round the world that catapulted Napa wines from a promising State senator from Chicago to the next President of the United States. Napa hasn't looked back since.

MOUTHWATERING LEROY

In the parlor game of “Which is the Greatest Burgundian Estate,” more times than not you will hear Leroy elevated above Domaine de la Romanee Conti. Madame Lalou Bize-Leroy began her career working for her family’s negociant business, Maison Leroy based in Auxey-Duresses. Today she also manages Domaine Leroy in Vosne-Romanee and Domaine d’Avenay near St. Romain. She also still owns a quarter of DRC, where she was co-director until she was famously ousted in 1992, partly in response to her starting Domaine Leroy, which she did with the 1988 purchase of the legendary Charles Noellat domaine. This gave her access to his enviable parcels of Richebourg, Romanee St. Vivant, Clos Vougeot, Boudots and Vignerondes in Nuits and Beaumonts and Brulees in Vosne. The domaine has been farmed biodynamically from the start and is famous for the unconventional training and pruning methods, which makes for severe crop reduction and produces only the healthiest grapes (just not very many of them!). No one makes wine like Leroy. Below are some early examples of the flagship parcels, all consigned from a repeat client who owns an incredible East Coast restaurant. A TREASURE TROVE OF WINE

If we at Heritage Auctions were prone to hyperbole, I could write that discovering this cellar was like Pastuer discovering Penicillin or Neil Armstrong landing on the moon. Perhaps this wine collection holds less global relevance, but to weary auction veterans used to traveling long distances with unknown outcomes, stepping into this chilly underground lair felt like we had opened a tomb worthy of an epic poem, or an Indiana Jones sequel at least.

Here were wines – bottles coveted, studied and blogged over – in large quantities, in absolutely incredible condition, with pristine provenance in row after row, case after case. We couldn't believe our eyes, but when we started sampling bottles with our kind consignor, we more than believed our palates. A bottle of '72 Conti was drop dead stunning. Full of life and vibrancy, this more than proved the rule that after a certain ageing period, there are no great wines just great bottles. This is a cellar of the celebrated as well as the often overlooked. '28 Latour was stacked alongside to a pallet of Groth Reserve. A case of La Tache was nestled next to negotiant bottlings from the '30s with kaleidoscopic color. The California selection is of particular notice, as some true unicorns, including a bottle of '71 Ridge Eisele, are here alongside early year Mayacamas and legends like '74 Heitz Martha's.

As stunning as the wines themselves is the provenance attached. These wines were all purchased from retail, mostly Mid-West and West Coast, on or near release. Our passionate consignor started when he was young, in the early '60s. While his brethren were dancing at Woodstock, he was hard at work and buying cases of DRC. Never one to let his precious wine out of his sight, he always stored these bottles in a custom-built home cellar under pristine temperature control set at 53 degrees and 70 percent humidity. He's no longer drinking much and thus, his treasures are now ready to find new homes.

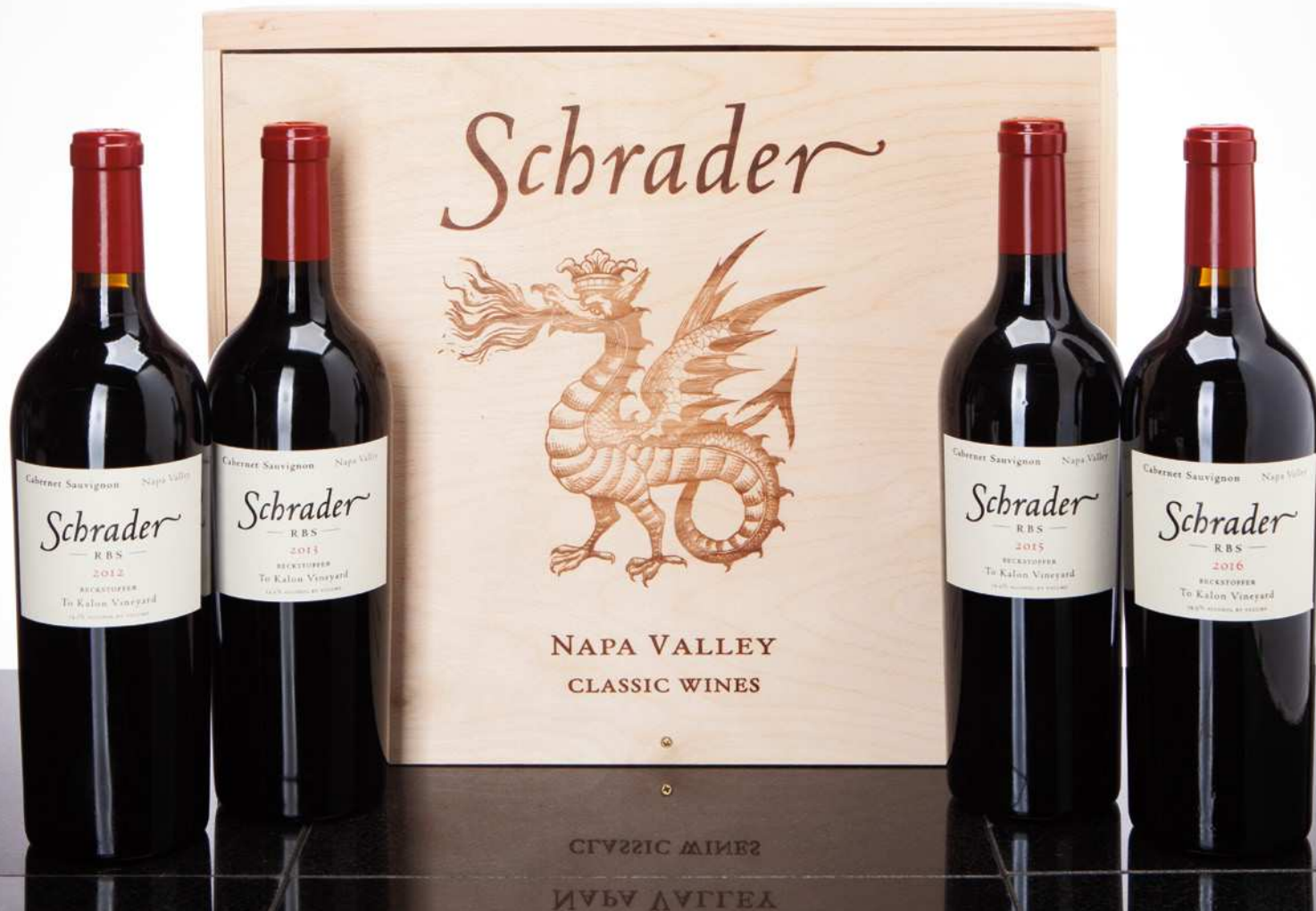
